








Logline

Fourteen-year-old Jackson Davage's nightmares become reality as a band of aliens, and his NASA grandfather, whisk him and his friends away to a starship making him their captain to save the universe one galaxy at a time.



JACKSON DAVAGE, highly intelligent, socially awkward, all knees and elbows, sleeps crammed into his airplane seat.

Jackson is not happy he has lost his spot as captain of the soccer team due to a concussion and a move to Ohio.





Picking up the family at the airport, GRANDPA (late 60s), former NASA director of solar system exploration, a cross between a rugged individualist & hippie, can't wait for Jackson to see the meteor shower tomorrow night from his cornfield.

This guy is either super cool or has really lost his mind.





WELCOME TO BEVIS, OHIO POP. 2,436.

Grandpa's pickup streaks through the small town passing ARJAY GUPTA, (15) standing on a ladder changing the letters on the marquee of the town movie theater.

Arjay sees Jackson in the back of the pickup truck and drops the marquee letters.

This will be the beginning of a beautiful or strange friendship.

At school the next day, Jackson's backpack is knocked off his shoulder by ERIC, the football captain who mocks Jackson for being a soccer player.

As Jackson kneels down to pick up his backpack a hand reaches out to grab it.

Jackson glances up to see OLIVIA MONTEZ -- powerful and mysterious, attractive, ready to take on the universe -- standing over him. Jackson becomes unglued by her quirky style - he's fallen hard for the first girl he sees.





Forced to introduce himself to the class, Jackson explains his family moved here because his grandpa is losing his mind.

Eric pushes for a party at Jackson's grandpa's corn field.

Jackson, happy to make new friends, thinks that he could arrange that.

"Great," says Eric, "We can finally see the alien crop circles that your grandpa talks about."

The class breaks into laughter as the bell rings.



Rescuing Jackson from the classroom Arjay leads him through a throng of students during the frenzied lunch rush.

Jackson finds Olivia working on her latest article for the school newspaper. When she breaks her pencil, Jackson offers his space pen, a gift from his grandpa.

Olivia tells Jackson she doesn't think his grandpa is crazy.



Jackson comes from the bathroom to find Grandpa looking out the bedroom window to the corn fields beyond.

A screeching sound and bright light silhouettes Grandpa.

Is it really aliens landing the corn fields?

Jackson rushes to the window to see...





It's just his dad, JOSH, whipping around the yard on the tractor.



The next day, Olivia returns Jackson's space pen. Jackson invites her in for coffee.

Jackson's mom, JUDY, introduces herself and Grandpa. But, Grandpa and Olivia have already met. She's been digging for information about the aliens.

Judy jokes that Bevis isn't Roswell.

Grandpa insists that aliens were transported from Roswell to Wright-Patterson Air Force base nearby.



In the corn field, Jackson looks through his binoculars. Grandpa paces back and forth with his flashlight pointed skyward, flicking it off and on.

As if on cue, a meteor STREAKS through the night sky.

Grandpa flicks his flashlight a bit faster now.

Then, a series of lights slow down behind the streaking lights. They arrange in three "V's" side by side and hover.



That's odd.

Suddenly -- a loud CRACK sounds. Then, far off from the field, the night sky comes alive.

Small meteors rain down throughout the corn field.

A SOUND like a SUPERSONIC JET approaching -- WHOOMM! - a BLUR races past them.



CRASH! Something has smashed into the cornfield and ignited the corn stalks.

The group takes off running.

The adults run toward the house.

The kids take off toward the barn.






Jackson and Olivia look around and discover the barn is loaded with robotic arrays with waldo-like hand controls, a monitor displays a 3D hologram of a space ship.

This is something more than Grandpa's workspace.

Metal peeks through the dirt floor. Jackson brushes the dirt aside, finds a door pull.

Jackson yanks at the pull, opening a hatch door, revealing a spiral staircase that leads to a hidden room underneath the barn floor.

They step inside and gasp at --




Clunking boots on the stairs.

Arjay is overjoyed. He's been waiting for this.


Waiting for this?

SERIES OVERVIEW




